Placing of the Pall: The colour of the pall is a reminder of our faith in the Resurrection. Covering the coffin is a ritual reference to Denis' baptismal robe. It is a sign of the Christian dignity of the person and signifies that all are equal in the eyes of God.

Father: May Christ who claimed Denis into Baptism now enfold him in His love, and bring him to eternal life. In life, Denis cherished the Gospel of Christ. May Christ now greet him with these words of eternal life: "Come blessed my Father".
